NOTES:

1. With the cessation of hostilities in November 1918, the British Army sent a large occupation force into Germany. This was progressively scaled back to two brigades, and these were withdrawn finally on 14 September 1929. This is the order of battle at the time of the withdrawal in September 1929. Three of the infantry battalions returned to Catterick in Yorkshire, where they formed the 14th Infantry Brigade, which itself was part of the newly reformed 5th Division.
