NOTES:

1. In February 1945, with the influx of Polish Prisoners of War who had served with the Axis Forces, it was possible to expand the cadre Armoured Grenadier Division into a full infantry division. The division was organised on the standard British infantry division establishment. It had the full support units, including three field ambulances, two field dressing stations, a divisional troops supply company, three brigade supply companies, a divisional ordnance field park and military police company. The division remained in the United Kingdom until it was disbanded in 1947.
