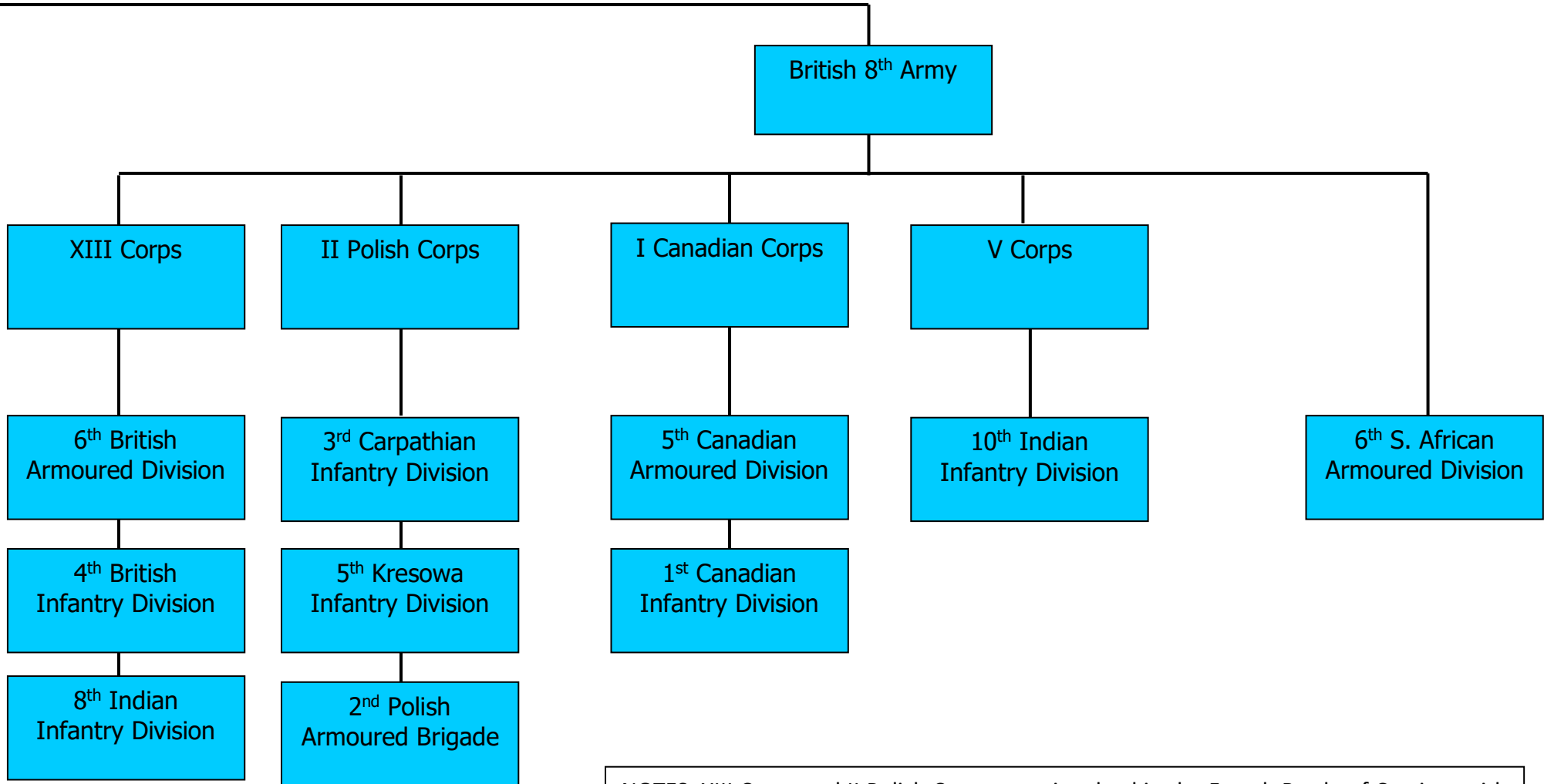

* This corps was created on 3 February 1944. The 4th Indian Division joined on 6 February and the 78th Division on 18 February. The corps dissolved on 26 March 1944. The 78th Infantry Division joined XIII Corps, the 4th Indian Infantry Division went to V Corps and 2nd N.Z. Division transferred to X Corps.

NOTES: XIII Corps and II Polish Corps were involved in the Fourth Battle of Cassino, with XIII Corps (reinforced by the 78th Infantry Division from the dissolved New Zealand Corps) driving up the Liri Valley, and II Polish Corps taking Monte Cassino. The other formations were static. The 6th South African Division had just arrived in Italy, joining I Canadian Corps on 28 May.
