NOTES:

1. The 4th Infantry Division was based in Eastern Command, had arrived in France on 1 October 1940. It came under the command of II Corps. Following the German invasion of the Low Countries, the division came under the command of III Corps for a period of three days, before reverting to II Corps command. It was evacuated from Dunkirk on 1 June 1940. The division remained in the United Kingdom until leaving for the invasion of North Africa on 12 March 1943. It had reorganised as a mixed division in June 1942, losing the 11th Infantry Brigade and gaining the 21st Tank Brigade.
2. This brigade was a pre-war Territorial Army formation, originally comprising three T.A. regiments of the Royal Tank Regiment. By 1943, of the three original regiments, only the 48th R.T.R.. On 26 April 1941, the 12th R.T.R. joined the brigade, and on 15 November 1941, the 145th Regiment, Royal Armoured Corps. This latter regiment had been formed by the conversion of the 8th Bn. The Duke of Wellington's Regiment (West Riding). All three units within the brigade were equipped with Churchill Mk. I and Mk. III tanks. Brigadier (Temporary) Thomas IVOR-MOORE commanded the brigade throughout the campaign in Italy. The brigade left the division on 12 December 1943 prior to the division's deployment to Italy.

4. Commanded by Brigadier (Temporary) Robert Gerald William CALLAGHAN, this pre-war Regular Army formation was one of the two infantry brigades that fought in Tunisia. CALLAGHAN joined the Connaught Rangers on 12 May 1915, and fought in the First World War. Transferring to the Royal Scots Fusiliers on 2 August 1922, he rose to command the ?? Battalion of the regiment on 24 June 1940. He assumed command of this brigade on 30 December 1941.
