## NOTES:

1. This was a first line Territorial Army Division, with its headquarters located in Glasgow. The Division remained in the United Kingdom until it left for France on 10 June 1940. It came under the command of G.H.Q. B.E.F. and was deployed south of the River Somme. It was deployed for only seven days, being evacuated back to the U.K. on 17 June 1940. This is the abbreviated order of battle for this formation during this period. The Division remained in the United Kingdom until 1944, and between May 1942 and June 1944, it trained in Mountain Warfare, but was never deployed as such. In August and September 1944, the Division trained in airlanding operations, but again was never deployed in this style of operation. The Division landed in North West Europe on 15 October 1944.
2. These regiments did not go to France with the Division. They temporarily came under the command of 49<sup>th</sup> Division in the U.K., before reverting to the command of this Division on its return from France.
3. This Field Company transferred in from 42<sup>nd</sup> Division on 7 June 1940.
4. This Field Company joined the Division on 7 December 1939.
