NOTES:

1. Headquarters, Northern Ireland District was based in Belfast, and in this period was under command of Major General Sir W. James N. COOKE-COLLIS, K.B.E., C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O.
2. This battalion was based in Londonderry.
3. This battalion was based at the Regiment's depot at Omagh.
4. This battalion was based in Holywood on the outskirts of Belfast.
5. This battalion was based in Belfast.
6. A Regular Army battalion, this unit was based in Ballykinler.
7. The Headquarters, Royal Artillery in Northern Ireland District came under the command of the Colonel Royal Artillery, Western Command. The North Irish Coast Defences were the only artillery units in the Province.
8. The 17th Heavy Battery formed the Lough Swilly Fire Command and was based at Lough Swilly, which lies in County Donegal to the west of Londonderry.
9. This detachment was part of the North Irish Coast Defences.
10. The Signal Company was based in Belfast.
11. These two companies were based in Belfast.
12. This company was based at Londonderry.
13. The R.A.M.C. Company was based at Holywood.
14. This detachment was based at Carrickfergus.
